36th Annual Christmas Bird Count (2017)

Co-sponsored by the MH Interpretive Program and The Society of Grasslands Naturalists

Many thanks to the 39 participants, including 4 new contributors, who surveyed territories during the Medicine Hat Christmas Bird Count (CBC) held on Sunday, December 17. Also, a big thank you goes out to the 17 feeder watchers who participated. The Interpretive Program continues to ask Hatters with feeders to monitor them on count day and there has been a consistent group of 15 to 25 observers annually. Having these folks participate usually adds one or more species seen exclusively by feeder watchers to the count's species total.

Count day temperatures were relatively mild (Low = -4° /High = 6° C) and winds were moderate (SW 15 to 25 km/hr). There was a light dusting of snow starting at 9:30 AM that lasted about 30 minutes but by afternoon it had melted and did not impact the count. One of the 24 territories in our count circle was not surveyed because of a last minute illness.

In 2017, 51 species were observed, which was 1 less than 2016, similar to species totals since 2001 (average = 55), and about 12% above the long-term average (35 years) of 46. Total individual birds counted (26,662) were 45% above 2016's total (18,337) and well above the long-term and 10-year averages (13,634 and 19,957, respectively). Most of this increase was attributed to the record number of Canada Geese (19,848) observed in this year's count. However, the individual bird total was not a count record as Mallards were 49% less than 2016 (3,382) and well below their record high in 2009 and their 10-year average (9,461 and 4,395, respectively). One other species that usually contributes heavily to the individual bird total, European Starling, exhibited a decline for the second consecutive year; this year's total (348) was 8% less than last year (360) and 21% below the long-term average (440). In contrast, Starling's averaged 1,274 from 2011 through 2015.

Feeder watchers did not observe any species exclusive of those monitoring assigned territories but had some great observations including Mourning Dove (1), Brown Creeper (1), and Cedar Waxwing (4). Four species, Belted Kingfisher (2), Townsend's Solitaire (1), Pine Siskin (1), and Common Grackle (16), were observed during Count Week but not on Count Day. No new species to the count were found in 2017.

In addition to Canada Goose, there were 3 species with high counts this year (Table 1). They were American Coot (20, previous high 12 in 2014), Eurasian Collared-dove (260, previous high 211 in 2016) and Red-winged Blackbird (21, previous high 4 in 1993). The high for Geese likely involved some double counted birds as flocks moved across territories during count day. Collared-doves first appeared on our CBC in 2003 and have increased steadily since then.

Regarding the Top Ten Species, the list remained consistent from 2016 with Canada Goose leading the way. Mallards remained in the second spot despite fewer individuals observed this year. The most noticeable change was the return of Common Redpoll to the list as they replaced Snow Bunting. The other 7 species were on the list in 2016.

Two Corvid species exhibited notable observations in 2017: Black-billed Magpies had their highest total (711) since 2003 (624) and appear to be fully recovered from low numbers during 2004 to 2009 (171 in 2008) likely associated with West Nile Virus; Common Ravens were at or near record numbers 3 of the past 4 years. Ravens were observed in 1982, the first year of our count, then not again until 2006 and only in small numbers (\leq 2) up to 2014. Also, Horned Lark (1) returned to its recent trend of few observations (\leq 1 from 2010 through 2015).

Nine species returned to the count in 2017 after relatively short absences. Greater Scaup (1) was last observed in 2009 whereas the other 6 species were last seen within the past 2 to 3 years – see Table 2 below for details.

There were 25 species typically seen on our CBC that were not observed in 2017 (see full list in Table 3 below). One species, Bohemian Waxwing, was observed in 2016 but had exhibited low numbers in recent counts. Of the remaining, 6 species have not been observed for more than 5 years: Canvasback (2008), Northern Harrier (2005), Short-eared Owl (2010), Purple Finch (2009), and Evening Grosbeak (2007).

I have also included a graph of House Sparrow and House Finch observations from our CBC (Figure 1). Some participants commented that House Sparrow numbers seemed low. House Sparrow observations decreased after House Finches appeared in 1995; both populations appear to be stable and observations seem to track annually.


