# 2009 SPRING BIRD AND FLOWER COUNT

Fellow Birder and Flower Watcher:

2009 was another great year as there were 11 species with recorded high counts, including an all time high for Eurasian wigeon (see Table 1 below). This occurred despite slight decreases in total participants, kilometres covered, and hours spent in the field (see Data Summary Table below). Many thanks to all those who volunteered their time this year!

Several species (gadwall, bald eagle, red-tailed hawk, tree swallow, violet-green swallow, American robin, and clay-coloured sparrow) with all time highs observed in 2009 are native species that are relatively common in the Medicine Hat area during spring and summer. Two of our more common year-round residents (downy woodpecker and blue jay) also had highs this year. Of note is that gadwall, red-tailed hawk, tree swallow, and American robin beat previous highs that were just observed in 2008.

Less frequently seen species observed in 2009 included snow goose (1), Eurasian wigeon (6 - ALL TIME HIGH), rough-legged hawk (1), greater yellowlegs (1), willow flycatcher (1), eastern phoebe (1), and lazuli bunting (1).

The top five for 2009 were: American robin (894), European starling (878), red-winged blackbird (634), Canada goose (596), and house sparrow (482).

No species were seen exclusively during count week.

As for flowers in bloom, there were 32 species observed, which is fairly typical for the spring count despite a hard winter and relatively cold spring.
