2010 SPRING BIRD AND FLOWER COUNT

Fellow Birders and Flower Watchers:

2010 was another great year as there were 2 new species seen on the count – Baird's sandpiper and rednecked phalarope. Furthermore, there were 17 species with recorded high counts up from 11 in 2009; 4 (turkey vulture, prairie falcon, pileated woodpecker, and red-eyed vireo) tied high counts from previous years while the reminder set new highs (see Table 1 below). The number of participants increased from 2009 with a corresponding increase in distances driven and covered on foot (see Data Summary Table below). Many thanks to all those who volunteered their time this year!

All of the species with observed highs in 2010 were native species except Eurasian-collared dove. Most of the Franklin's gulls were observed in 2 flocks (580 and 375, respectively) by separate observers. Robins exhibited a high for the third straight year and highs for 2 species (Eurasian-collared dove and violet-green swallow) occurred previously in 2009. This is only the second time common ravens have been observed during a spring count and they were observed as two unique groups by separate observers (3 and 6, respectively). Water birds (waterfowl, shorebirds, gulls) accounted for the 2 new species observed and 7 of 17 high counts recorded.

Less frequently seen species observed in 2010 included pied-billed grebe (1), sharp-shinned hawk (1), black-necked stilt (1), solitary sandpiper (1), common nighthawk (1), eastern phoebe (1), white-throated sparrow (1), and bobolink (1).

The top five for 2010 were: European starling (1,171), Franklin's gull (1,006), Canada goose (930), American robin (918), and ring-billed gull (862).

One species, black-billed cuckoo (1), was seen exclusively during count week.

As for flowers in bloom, there were 53 species observed, which is above average for the spring count. Likely, the unusually wet spring translated to more wildflowers and increased numbers of water birds observed.
